

Pursuing subspecialty training in sports and arthroscopic surgery has been my goal since my residency (2018-2022). This ambition led me to explore various fellowship options, and I eventually found Professor Wong's email address. My journey toward fellowship began from that moment.

This was an enriched experience that provided both professional and personal growth. Under the guidance of Prof. Tak man Wong leading the team, I was exposed to the arthroscopic world that emphasized innovation and precision in orthopaedic care. I had the privilege of working alongside an exceptional team, including Prof Wong, Dr. Yau ,Dr Kevin ,Brian Siu, Brian Leung and Martin. It was an invaluable learning experience at Queen Marry Hospital and the Duchess of Kent Children's hospital.

My fellowship documentation process started from May 2024, I would like to thanks Ms .Eva Liu for her exceptional help and meticulous coordination. She helped me start from medical registration, E-visa, accommodation, journey map and much more. I bothered her a lot during this duration and she humbly answered my all queries. I landed at Hong Kong on 19th January 2025 having a lot of excitement in my heart and mind.

CLINICAL AND PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCE:

On my first day, I met Dr. Kevin, who briefed me about the department, the schedule, and my duties. He then led me to the clinic, where I met Martin and Prof. Wong. I saw various shoulder cases that had never encountered in my entire clinical experience. It was truly mesmerizing.

As a fellow in the Sports Division, I had the invaluable opportunity to immerse myself in every facet of the division's daily operations. This included not only outpatient clinics but also ward duties and hands-on work in the operating room. The Division of Sports and Arthroscopic Surgery is a dynamic environment, driven by enthusiasm and a strong sense of dedication to patient care and advanced surgical practices.

Throughout my fellowship, I was fortunate to assist in a wide variety of sports surgery cases, each of which broadened my expertise and sharpened my skills. My experience ranged from performing routine ACL repairs to more complex revision ACL surgeries. I also had the opportunity to assist in intricate procedures such as rotator cuff repairs, Bankart and Remplisage repairs, revision rotator cuff surgeries, bony Bankart procedures, and reverse shoulder replacements. Additionally, I was involved in meniscal repairs, biceps tenodesis, and supra-capsular reconstruction. Each of these cases required a unique approach, which deepened my understanding of both the technical aspects and decision-making processes in sports surgery.

I also had the chance to assist with hip arthroscopy, iliopsoas release, patellar chondroplasty, latissimus dorsi repair, MPFL reconstruction, and surgery for external hip snapping. These experiences further enriched my knowledge and provided me with a well-rounded skill set in managing a diverse range of sports-related injuries."


OT EXPERIENCE:


